Hiring of Consultancy Firm for Digital Economy Sector Assessment Study

Date: 9th April 2025 **Time:** 12:30 PM

A virtual meeting was convened to discuss the proposed consultancy assignment under the Digital Economy Enhancement Project (DEEP). The session began with a presentation that introduced the DEEP initiative and the Expression of Interest (EOI), outlining its objective to support digital transformation in Pakistan. The consultancy aims to assess the current status of the digital economy in the country to establish benchmarks. These baselines will help monitor progress in the coming years as Pakistan expands its digital infrastructure and services. The study is intended to provide measurable indicators to evaluate the country's transformation and guide future planning. After this the floor was opened for questions from interested firms.

Mr. Nur from Visa Middle East asked how the outcomes of the study would connect to broader initiatives such as citizen and business super apps, and whether the assessment would include consumer digital behavior such as fashion and online shopping.

Response: It was clarified that while the study may not directly feed into the portals, it contributes to the wider ecosystem by setting a digital baseline. The scope includes fintech, e-commerce, and digital habits across consumer sectors.

Mr. Jaffer Askari (McKinsey & Company) inquired about submission requirements, specifically whether a prescribed format is required and if the financial turnover must be quoted in rupees.

Response: It was confirmed that there is no mandatory format under the CQS method; bidders may choose the most suitable format for their submissions. Financial amounts must be stated in Pakistani rupees. For international bidders, financials in other currencies will be internally converted for evaluation.

Mr. Usman Nasir (Independent Consultants Ltd.) asked whether the ministry had predetermined end goals or if it expects the consultant to define those goals and provide a roadmap and also requested a two-week extension in the submission deadline.

Response: It was explained that while there is an overall direction, the ministry expects the consultant to propose both the end goals and the strategy to achieve them. It was also made clear that there is currently no plan for an extension, and the deadline will remain firm if a sufficient number of responses are received in time.

Ms. Nasha Tengra from PWC asked if she could submit a list of scope-related questions after the meeting, The list of questions along with MoITT response is as follows:
